Ways of saying the number 0

In a series of numbers:

You can pronounce 0 like the letter O, when you are giving a series of numbers such as a credit card number or a flight number

Ways of saying the number 0

In dates: Say **oh** when giving the name of a year, 1904 (“nineteen **oh** four”)

In mathematics, science, and technical contexts:

Br/E: Say **nought** or **zero**

Am/E: Say **zero**

Ways of saying the number 0

*In temperatures: 0° **zero***

In sports, for scores of 0:

Br/E: Say **nil**

Am/E: Say **zero** or **nothing**

In tennis: Say **love**
